Did You Know There are 3 Different PET Models?

In 1994 the basic PET came into being as an adult size with cargo space. It was made with a hand cranking system for the leg handicapped for rough, rural areas as its prime location intent. About 2000 the child crank PET came into production to serve smaller children. It has also gone to small adults. Then field requests came for something to go a step further for those who didn't have the upper body coordination or strength—i.e. children with cerebral palsy and the elderly. Around 2006 the development of the Pull PET began.

version, three
make the child
crank, while most
shops produce the
adult crank. We
begin showing pictures of these versions with a report
received in October from **Ghana**

showing bigger children getting adult crank PETs. Thanks to everyone who helps make these reports possible from donors to volunteers to supply vendors to distribution partners.
